AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF COLLINSVILLE, MADISON COUNTY, ILLINOIS THE QUESTION WHETHER THE TOWNSHIP OF COLLINSVILLE SHOULD HAVE THE AUTHORITY UNDER PUBLIC ACT 096-0176 TO ARRANGE FOR THE SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY FOR THE RESIDENTIAL AND SMALL COMMERCIAL RETAIL CUSTOMER OF THE UNINCORPORATED PORTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF COLLINSVILLE THAT IS NOT OTHERWISE A PART OF A MUNICIPALITY OF MADISON COUNTY, ILLINOIS AND WHO HAVE NOT OPTED OUT OF SUCH PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Township of Collinsville, MADISON County, Illinois, ("TOWNSHIP"), duly established pursuant to law; and

WHEREAS, recently, the Illinois power Agency Act, Chapter 20, Illinois Compiled Statutes, Act 3855, was amended by Public Act 96-176 which added Section 1-92 entitled "Aggregation of Electrical Load by Municipalities and Counties". (Hereinafter referred to as the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, under the Act if the Township seeks to operate an aggregation program under the Act as an opt-out program for specific residential and small commercial retail customers, then prior to an adoption of an ordinance to establish such a program, the Township must first submit a referendum to its residents to determine whether or not the aggregation program shall operate as an opt-out aggregation program for residential and small commercial retail customers;

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities find that it is in the best interest of the Township to operate the aggregation program under the Act as an opt-out program in that portion of the Township in an unincorporated portion of the county not otherwise part of a municipality and to submit the question to the electors in a referendum pursuant to the Act;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWNSHIP of COLLINSVILLE, MADISON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1: The corporate authorities of the Township find the recitals set forth above are true and correct.

Section 2: The corporate authorities find and determine that it is in the best interest of the Township to operate the aggregation program under the Act as an opt-out program.

Section 3: The Township Clerk is directed to certify and submit on or before January 28, 2021, the following question to the MADISON County Clerk to be placed on the ballot for the General Election to be held on April 6, 2021; such question to be in the following form:

"Shall the Township of COLLINSVILLE, MADISON COUNTY, ILLINOIS have the authority to arrange for the supply of electricity for its residential and small commercial retail customers, in the unincorporated portions of Collinsville Township not otherwise part of a municipality of Madison County, Illinois, who have not opted out of such program"

Section 4: If a majority of the electors voting on the question vote in the affirmative, then the corporate authorities may implement an opt-out aggregation program for residential and small commercial retail customers.

Section 5: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law. That the Township Clerk of the Township of COLLINSVILLE shall be and hereby is authorized and instructed to publish this ordinance in pamphlet form.
