**PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY RESPONSE**

A large scale emergency can happen at any time without advance notice. At our county level it should be noted that it is the responsibility of every person, city, school, first responder, public and private business to be prepared to withstand to the best of their ability the impact of a disaster, manmade or natural, until further assistance arrives from the state and federal level. Time and time again during disasters it has taken the preparedness of everyone to have successful outcomes.

To increase our public health preparedness, one project this year was to increase in number and train our Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) Volunteers, who are citizen responders. Work has been done regionally between bordering Missouri and Illinois Health Departments to network and recruit new volunteers for our MRC units in the area. The ultimate goal is to build a Gateway Volunteer Network in our bi-state region that can respond when called to assist in disasters therefore increasing our response strength.

Technology advances at the department in the area of social media will increase the speed of official information to the public when the public needs it. Technology is also being explored and tested in order to support the dispensing of preventative medications at our mass dispensing clinics via online questionnaires and bar-coding. It is our goal to be ready and we hope it is your goal, too, so we can all pull through disasters together.


**To the Citizens of Madison County:**

On behalf of the Madison County Board of Health and Health Advisory Committee, I am pleased to submit to you the 19th Annual Report of the Madison County Health Department for the fiscal year December 1, 2012 through November 30, 2013. This report chronicles the varied health department services provided to our county to promote, protect, and assure conditions for optimal health.

For example, Environmental Health Staff conducted over 3,000 food inspections and tested over 300 batches of mosquitoes for West Nile Virus and other mosquito-borne diseases. Nursing Staff investigated over 2,000 reportable diseases and case managed 855 women enrolled in the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program. Emergency Response has recruited and maintained over 250 Medical Reserve Corps volunteers to assist this department in responding to public health emergencies. Health Promotion worked on objectives and interventions dealing with tobacco prevention and smoke free environments.

In addition, the health department also was involved in assisting individuals with obtaining health insurance through Illinois Marketplace as prescribed within the Affordable Care Act.

Public health is to assure that people may live healthy lives through community-wide prevention and protection programs. We work with many partners at the state, regional, and local level to meet the health needs of our community. The continuation of collaborative efforts involving staff, stakeholders, elected officials, and residents are imperative to realize this department's vision of a "Healthy Madison County". Thank you for your continued support to improve the health of the health of Madison County.

This year the primary health promotion focus has been implementing tobacco prevention and cessation programs and policies; administering, implementing and advancing the process for the We Choose Health grant policy initiatives; enacting duties as the Public Information Officer; seeking and writing grants for MCHD; developing, leading, and maintaining Communications for MCHD; working on MCHD Strategic Plan goals; and collaborating and planning to address health priorities in Madison County.
