**PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY RESPONSE**

The goal of this division is to ensure the health department as a whole monitors for and is prepared to respond decisively to: terrorist attacks, new and emerging infectious diseases or disasters. This is accomplished in a collaborative effort with other Local, State and/or Federal responding agencies and Private Citizens. The type of response and collaboration is determined by the type and extent of the event, each entity doing what they do best, taking the lead as their area of expertise is called upon. Collaborative relationships are maintained with law enforcement, emergency management, fire service, Department Of Justice, businesses, Lewis and Clark Community College, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, area hospitals, schools and various other partners here and across the river.

The health department as a whole is more prepared than ever to respond to a public health event due to our many accomplishments this year. A volunteer pool now exists of 166 with 50 percent of those trained and ready to respond when needed. A quarterly volunteer newsletter was started to keep in touch with our volunteers. Exercises for the year were geared toward practicing the health department's response to pandemic flu and natural disaster (earthquake). Health department staff has been active in the state committee development of new preparedness materials that will be used statewide which will add uniformity to regional and state responses. The department was reviewed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) this year; our professionalism, our ever improving readiness levels and our "can do" attitude was noted by the CDC staff.

**HEALTH PROMOTION SERVICES DIVISION**

The goal of Health Promotion Services is to educate citizens about the positive effects of a healthy lifestyle and to encourage them to alter lifestyles through changes in behavior. Lifestyle changes are facilitated through the combination of efforts to enhance awareness, change behavior, and by creating environments that support favorable health practices. These lifestyle changes often require addressing physical, mental, and social issues contributing to the behavior.

Health Promotion Services administers programs with schools, community organizations, collaborations, citizens, state and regional programs, coalitions, and media. Health Promotion collaborates with many county agencies, organizations, and community members to prepare and offer education. This year the primary health promotion focus has been implementing a tobacco prevention and cessation program, assisting with youth alcohol prevention initiatives and safety programs, continuing outreach and education with breast and cervical cancer programs, continuing collaboration for primary Peer Leadership programs, continuing a Heart Smart for Teens program, continuing a prostate and testicular cancer awareness and screening program, administering a school-based dental sealant program, implementing social marketing campaigns, and partnering in the Metro East Alliance for Breast Health on a Ticket for the Cure regional social marketing campaign.
